On January 1, 2026, Sonoma County is expanding its services to help people with severe substance use needs access more treatment, resources, and housing.

Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 43 (SB 43) making significant changes to the state's involuntary detention and conservatorship laws under the Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) Act. 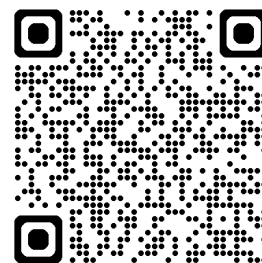


## IMPACT
