

## Permanent Supportive Housing HUD Project Quality Threshold Requirements (New Projects)

Please ensure you review the following requirements based on project type when submitting your project application and questionnaire. HUD will review the application submission in the e-snaps system and score the new project applications on whether or not your project hits the following quality threshold requirements. If you do not include this information in your application in e-snaps, your new project could be rejected by HUD. Although these responses are included in our supplemental questionnaire, HUD does not receive responses to the questionnaire (only what is in your actual application in e-snaps).

New Permanent Housing projects must receive at least 4 out of the 6 points available for this project type. New Permanent Housing projects that do not receive at least 4 points will be rejected.
