1:55 Root Cause Analysis (RCA)

- Action Team reviewed RCA for strategy 5.1: Increase awareness of and coordinate training resources and supports for paid and unpaid caregivers. Hot roots focused on:
 - Lack of messaging and training for unique groups including: new generations moving into caregiving, solo and dyad agers, sandwich generation, and unpaid family caregivers.
 - Too few/weak connections between service providers, hospitals, gov't, etc.
- Team members created an RCA for 5.2: Expand the caregiver workforce through development programs, career pathways, and offering financial incentives/stipends. Hot roots focused on:
 - Geography is a challenge
 - Low pay for demanding work
 - o No path to career growth/limited future advancement
 - Need to frame caregiving as a learning opportunity and jumping off point for any career
 - o Caregiving is seen as "women's work"

• Across three breakout groups, team members identified the need to prioritize a targeted, meaningful training continuum; rebrand what it means to be a caregiver; and expand and deepen awareness of services available.
